►► Endowed Chairs at the U.S. Air Force Academy

Endowed chairs are high-impact investments in the U.S. Air Force Academy's academic excellence. Donors create endowed chairs to support, in perpetuity, outstanding USAFA faculty members dedicated to educating, training and inspiring men and women to become leaders of character for the Air Force and Space Force.

BENEFITS OF ENDOWED CHAIRS

- **Recruitment and retention** — Because top-notch faculty are in high demand, endowed chairs give the Academy an edge in attracting and retaining preeminent professors across its departments and centers. Endowed chairs are filled by recognized scholars who have achieved a terminal degree — in most cases, a doctorate — in a specific area or discipline.
 - **Academic rigor** — Endowed chairs provide the faculty holder with a reliable stream of funding for a range of academic uses. Funds can be used for research, continuing education, equipment and technology, and other projects that continually challenge cadets and further the Academy's overall academic excellence.
 - **Research and innovation** — Endowed chair holders may use some of the funds generated annually to support their research projects. At USAFA, research brings real-world insights and understanding, helps solve problems through innovative thinking and approaches and nurtures industry partnerships. Cadets and other faculty members benefit through engaging learning and leadership development.
- Endowed chairs are an investment not only in academic excellence, but also in the reputation of the Air Force Academy as a prestigious undergraduate institution and elite military service academy. This, in turns, bolsters USAFA's ability to attract top college-bound students interested in a life of service.

HOW TO CREATE AN ENDOWED CHAIR AT USAFA

A gift of \$5 million or more may establish a permanent endowed chair. The donor may designate the scholar's department or general field of study at the time of the gift. An endowed chair can bear the donor's name or any name that is of significance to the donor or relevant to the chair's focus. At USAFA, individuals, corporations and foundations have created endowed chairs.

A gift to establish an endowed chair should be made through the Air Force Academy Foundation.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

The endowed chair is managed by ARDI. The Air Force Academy Foundation and ARDI work closely together to create an excellent experience for the donor and deliver impact on USAFA's academic mission element.

About 4.5% of the endowment is used annually to support the holding faculty member's priorities. The dean of the faculty selects the professors who will occupy the chairs.

PRIORITIZING ENDOWED CHAIRS

ARDI and the Air Force Academy Foundation are committed to supporting the Academy's mission to develop leaders of character and specifically to advancing USAFA's efforts to recruit and retain outstanding faculty members. They share a long-term goal of expanding the number of perpetually endowed chairs and collaborate to ensure seamlessness with gift management, annual reporting to the donor and ongoing recognition.

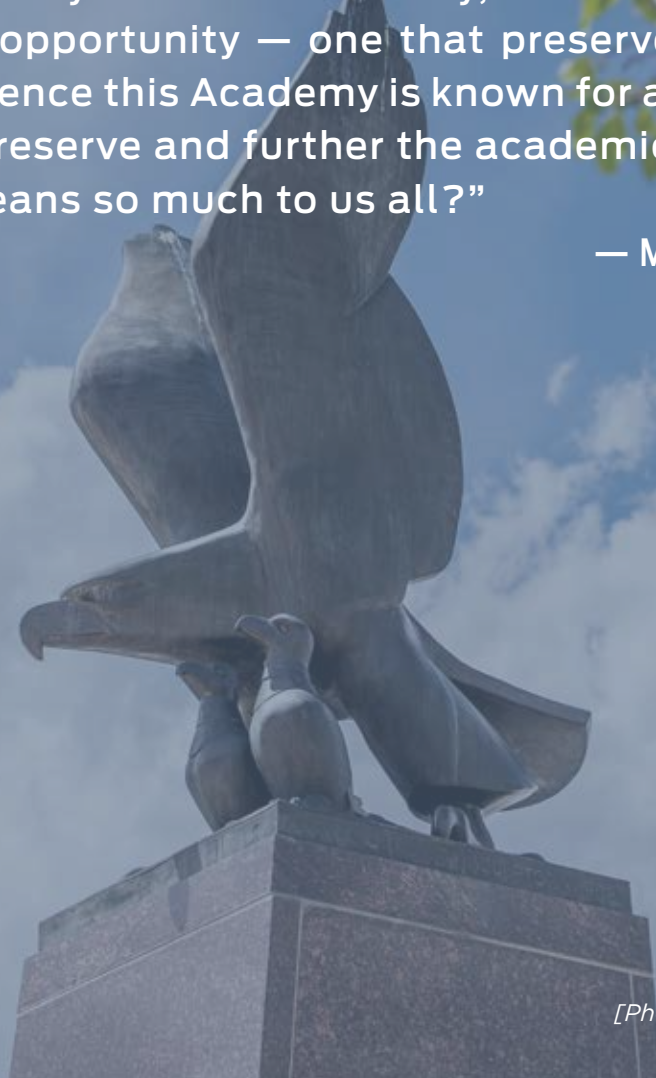
